





Eligible Applicants

- For-profit entities;
- State, local governments;
- Indian Tribes:
- School districts;
- Not-for-profit organizations;
- Institutions of higher education; and
- Special purpose districts (e.g., public utilities districts, fire districts, conservation districts, and ports)
- Construction Costs are not allowed!

Wood Innovation Grants

Purpose: Stimulate, expand, and support wood products markets and wood energy markets.

Program goals:

- Reduce hazardous fuels and improve forest health on National Forest System and other forest lands
- Reduce costs of forest management on all land types
- Promote economic and environmental health of communities

Funding Award Ceiling: \$300,000

 <u>Exception</u>: Up to \$1 million for stationary wood energy systems greater than 5 MW in thermal output

Cooperator Match: 1:1 or 100%

Applicants must contribute matching funds equal to 100% of the Forest Service requested funds.

Community Wood Grants

Purpose: Support local economies by funding turn-key, ready-to-implement projects that either

- expand the number of thermally-led wood energy systems; OR
- build or expand innovative wood products manufacturing facilities.

Program goals:

- Install thermally-led wood energy system (<5 MW) OR to build or expand innovative wood product
- · Improve forest health; and
- Stimulate local economies.

Funding Award Ceiling: \$1 million

 Special circumstances: \$1.5 million per grant and no more than 50% of total capital costs. Advanced approval required.

Cooperator Match

- Traditional match is not required-leveraging is required.
- Award amount can be no more than 35% of total capital costs
 - Remaining 65% of capital costs must be provided by applicant
 - Ex. \$1 million award requires \$1.857 million in cooperator contributions

Wood Products Infrastructure Assistance (WPIA) Grants

Purpose: Establish, reopen, retrofit, expand, or improve a sawmill or other woodprocessing facility.

Projects must:

- Procure significant amount of feedstock from ecosystem restoration projects on federal or Indian lands
- Federal or tribal lands must be at risk of unnaturally severe wildfire or insect or disease infestation
- Be near the ecosystem restoration project

Funding Award Ceiling: \$1 million

Cooperator Match

No match requirement.

Grant Program Key Points

- All NOFOs dependent on Administration/Department approval and funding availability.
- Applicants must be registered and have an active registration in SAM.gov to apply
- Engage early and often with Regional Coordinators
- Ensure your project meets the intent and eligibility of the grant program
- Application information can be found on Grants.gov and Wood Innovations webpage
- Keep up to date with the various program deadlines (TENTATIVE)


