



<p><b>Pre- Trip Checklist</b></p>	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>
<p><b>Fluids:</b> Check engine oil, coolant, transmission, brake, and windshield wiper fluids.</p>	
<p><b>Belts &amp; Hoses:</b> Inspect for cracks, leaks, or loose fittings.</p>	
<p><b>Suspension &amp; Steering:</b> Check under the vehicle for loose bolts, cracks, or worn bushings that take a beating on dirt roads.</p>	
<p><b>Tires:</b> Check the tread on current tires and confirm your <b>full-size spare tire</b> is properly inflated and that you have a functional jack and lug wrench.</p>	
<p><b>Mirrors:</b> Make sure all mirrors are functional, properly adjusted, and clean.</p>	
<p><b>Gas:</b> Make sure you have enough gas to get to and from destination as well as some to spare if you get stuck or have to take detours.</p>	
<p><b>Destination:</b> Tell someone where you are going and when you will be back.</p>	
<p><b>Weather:</b> Check weather forecast to prepare for adverse events during trip.</p>	
<p><b>Maps:</b> Carry GPS Unit, download maps, or have a paper copy of maps.</p>	
<p><b>Recovery &amp; Emergency Equipment:</b> Carry tow straps, chains, a shovel, tire plug kit, portable air compressor, jack, and lug wrench.</p>	
<p><b>Personal supplies:</b> Pack food, water, extra clothing, broadband radio, and medical supplies in the event of becoming stranded.</p>	
<p><b>Onsite Adjustments Checklist</b></p>	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>
<p><b>Tire Pressure:</b> Lower tire pressure to increase tires footprint (and manage washboards).</p>	
<p><b>Secure Cargo:</b> Make sure all gear is strapped down or tightly packed to prevent shifting during dangerous projectiles</p>	
<p><b>Engage 4WD/AWD:</b> Engage this at the start of driving on dirt roads to distribute power and improve traction.</p>
